Minister's Letter - January 27, 2019

There's an old joke about the job of a pastor that goes something like this: "How difficult could it possibly be? You read and write about one book (the Bible), and only work for a couple of hours on Sunday morning."

Now I know that you know there's much more to the minister's job than that. A minister, of course, presides at baptisms, weddings and memorial services, and I had the honor of doing so at two, one, and three, respectively, during 2018. I also had the joy of welcoming three new members into covenant with our church community last year.

But I know full well that Sunday morning worship tends to be the one time in which I consistently get to see many if not most of you. As this is the case, I wanted to take this opportunity to catch you up on some of the other ministry activities on which I've been spending time and effort since arriving in here Navarre.

Council and Committees

During 2018, I met with the Church Council on a monthly basis, and at least once with all our church committees (Christian Education, Music, Memorial, Nominating and Pastor-Parish Relations). As I mentioned in a recent Pastor's Letter, the three groups that comprise Church Council, the Deacons, Elders and Trustees, will have considerably more autonomy and responsibility than in years past and I anticipate meeting with all these teams as warranted. There are, of course, new members being elected to all these committees at our Annual Meeting, and I look forward to sitting down with all these groups in the near future in order to make plans for our church for 2019 and beyond.

Our Community

On the second Wednesday afternoon of every month, Rev. Orion Aubihl, Esther Berlyoung, and I serve Communion at Altercare on Park Street. It is a ministry that the residents find meaningful, and both they and the staff really enjoy having people from the community participate in activities there. I also officiated one of the semi-annual memorial services at Altercare this past year, honoring residents who had died in the preceding six months. If anyone is interested in joining us for the Lord's Supper at Altercare at any time, please just let me know — and if anyone has any ideas for other activities (formal or informal) that we might share with people at Altercare or anywhere else in our community, please let me know that too.

In Spring 2018, I was invited to join the Board of Directors of the Western Stark YMCA. The Y directors felt that it was important to have a Christian clergyperson from the community serve on the board, and I was thrilled to be able to do so. The Y has always been known for providing great programs and services to people of all ages, and I look forward to exploring new ways for the Y and the churches in our area to work together going forward.

I also currently serve as the clergy advisor to The Salvation Army's Fairless Service Unit. Our church has a long history of working with the Salvation Army, and the high level of support that this group continues to provide to people in need in the four communities of our school district is awe-inspiring. I highly encourage you to get involved in any way you can.

The United Church of Christ

This fall I was asked to join the Committee on Ministry ("COM") of the Living Water Association - Ohio North East (the new entity that was created by the merger of the former Eastern Ohio and (over) $_{Page 5}$

Western Reserve Associations in late 2018). The COM is responsible for, among other things, the credentialing of UCC ministers in our region. The specific working group of which I am a part works with all potential new ministers who are in the process of discerning their respective calls to serve. We meet as a working group for about a half a day once per month, and as a full committee for a few hours once per quarter, at the UCC in Bath.

One requirement to maintain ministerial standing in our Association is continuing education, which can be fulfilled through ongoing participation in a Clergy Practice Group, a gathering of UCC ministers and members-in-discernment (those who are currently seeking ordination or licensure in the UCC) focused on professional development in various facets of ministry. In 2018 I joined such a group, the focus of which is excellence in the craft of preaching. The group is comprised of members from all over our vast Association (fun fact: our Association, on its own, would be the fifth largest Conference in the UCC), who serve in a variety of rural, suburban and urban settings throughout Northeast Ohio. We meet one afternoon per month at the UCC in Hudson.

Clergy Associations

I became involved in the Fairless Clergy Association almost immediately upon arriving in Navarre. It has been a joy to get to know all the pastors and laypeople who participate in this ecumenical group. I know that many of you are familiar with the Thanksgiving, Lessons and Carols, and Lenten services sponsored by the FCA — it is always wonderful to see the St. Paul UCC contingent at all of these! In addition, the FCA provides essential financial support in order to meet urgent needs in the schools and to fund food assistance and other essential service programs in our area.

At the invitation of a UCC ministry colleague, I began participating in a twice-monthly study group of interfaith clergy serving the Canton area last year. This informal group consists of colleagues from a variety of religious traditions — both Jewish and Christian — and provides an important connection to issues and concerns that impact our region, our country and the world.

Bible Study

In the summer of 2018, we embarked on a three-part Bible study based on the Massachusetts Bible Society's Exploring the Bible curriculum. Having completed the "What Is the Bible?" and "Introducing the Old Testament" courses by the end of last year, we will be looking at the "Introducing the New Testament" course in the very near future. If there are particular issues or themes that you would be interested in considering in a future Bible or book study, please reach out to me.

The fifteen months since my family and I came to Navarre — and the eleven months since I was installed as your minister — have gone by incredibly quickly; it has been a time filled with the joys and challenges of parish ministry. I know that we still have much to learn from and about one another, but please always know this: It is truly a privilege to serve you and this community, and I am both humbled and honored by the trust you placed in me. And wherever the road may take us, I look forward to taking that journey together.
